INTRODUCTION

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE



“Nothing of eternal significance has ever happened apart from prayer” – Dr. Jerry Falwell

Jerry Falwell repeated that line until we heard it in our sleep. At the time, I didn’t grasp the importance of what he was teaching us but time and life has made me grateful for that line.

I understood the necessity of prayer. I grew up in church. As a family, we prayed in our home. I prayed as a young preacher-boy wanting to know God’s direction for my life and ministry.

But prayer was not a joy. Prayer was a struggle. It was still something I did and not part of who I was. Prayer was a last resort and not my first response. I needed to understand the urgency and significance of prayer. That, as Jesus reminds us, “apart from me, you can do nothing” (John 15:5).

That is the reason we’re taking these next fourteen days to focus on a season of prayer. As a church, we want to do more than understand the necessity of prayer—to tag prayer onto our well-designed plans. We want to be men and women of prayer. A church that understands the urgency and eternal significance of prayer. That apart from dependence on the Lord Jesus, we can do nothing.

This guide is designed to guide you in that journey. It’s not here as another point of anxiety or pressure—something else to overwhelm you. This guide offers help to establish a focused, effective, and enjoyable time of prayer in the days ahead. That together as a church family we can seek God to works of eternal significance through the prayers of Crowfield Baptist Church.



CREATING A LIFESTYLE OF PRAYER

Effective prayer is like spiritual breathing. Creating a lifestyle of prayer is essential for our life in Christ.

To understand how we develop a lifestyle of prayer, we can look at the life and ministry of the Lord Jesus as an example.

1. Have a certain time.

The gospel writers tell us about patterns in Jesus' own life and ministry. How He would rise early to pray. While praying in the wee hours of the morning is not required by the Scriptures, the wisdom of the Savior reminds us of our need to set a schedule. Prayer will not happen if we don't make it a priority. Make a daily appointment with the Lord! Whether it's first thing in the morning, at lunch, or in the evening, make the appointment and keep it.

2. Have a certain place.

Jesus would remove Himself from the disciples or the crowds. He would find a certain place—a private place—to pray. Jesus even encourages us to find a hidden place to pray (Mt 6:5-6). Having a designated place to pray helps to remove distractions and frees us to worship and pray openly.

3. Have a certain plan.

The Lord Jesus taught His disciples to pray (Mt 6:9-15). He offered prayer points and a prayer outline. We call it the Lord's Prayer. But Jesus offers it as a tool to guide the prayers of His disciples. Key points we need to emphasize as we develop a lifestyle of prayer. Your prayers don't always have to look the same, but it helps to have a plan to guide your prayer time.

One model is the ACTS prayer outline:

- Adoration – Begin by praising God for who He is and what He has done.
- Confession – Openly confess those sins that burden your soul. Take time to repent, knowing that when you confess your sin, He is faithful and just to forgive and cleanse you from all unrighteousness.
- Thanksgiving – Express gratitude to God for His blessings, guidance, and answered prayer.
- Supplication – Pray for needs—both your own and those of others. Pray for guidance, healing, financial provision, etc. He cares for you and wants to know your needs.

A SPECIAL WORD TO PARENTS

We want to share a special message to parents, especially moms, with young children.

Martin Lloyd-Jones once spoke with a group of medical students about the need for Bible study and prayer. The students complained that their training didn't allow them time for such things. He bristled, "I am a doctor. I have been where you are. You have time for what you want to do."

What he said next is of great importance to you as a parent of young children. After a long pause, Lloyd-Jones said, "I make only one exception: the mother of preschool-aged children does not have time and emotional resources."

He was not eliminating your need to spend time with the Lord. Lloyd-Jones, the wise pastor he was, recognized that there are stages of life where you really don't have time to do much, and you shouldn't feel guilty about it. Children will often leave you emotionally drained. But prayer and time in the Word will give you strength. Even if it's only 5 minutes as you sit in the school pick-up line, or at your desk, or in your truck at lunch, give it to the Lord.

He will do great things with the little you place in His hands.



14 DAYS OF PRAYER

Day 1 - Praying for Personal Renewal and Revival

Exodus 33:18-19 – Then Moses said, “Now show me your glory.” And the LORD said, “I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the LORD, in your presence. I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that God would reveal Himself and His glory as we seek Him over the next 14 days.
- Ask the Lord to direct you into all truth as you read His Word.
- Pray for understanding and faith as you consider who God is and how He desires to work in your life.
- Pray that the people of God at Crowfield Baptist would be drawn to worship and adore Him.

Day 2 – Praying for the Presence and Power of the Spirit

Acts 1:8 – But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Prayer Points:

- Pray for the presence and power of the Holy Spirit to be known among us because, without Him, we can do nothing.
- Pray for courage and boldness to serve as witnesses to His saving power.
- Pray for an increase in Crowfield members going into our community to serve and to the nations on mission trips.
- Ask God to send many from our church family—even you! —to those who have yet to hear the good news of what God has done in Christ Jesus.

Day 3 – Praying for Disciple Making

John 15:5 – I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing.

Prayer Points:

- Pray for Crowfield's effectiveness in making disciples.
- Ask the Lord to make us fruitful and for a renewed commitment to being disciple-making disciples.
- Pray that God would develop in you a passion to invest in the lives of others.
- Pray especially for our children and student ministries. Ask God to save our children and raise them up to be His servants in the world.

Day 4 – Praying to Be People Amazed by Grace

Ephesians 2:4-5 – But because of His great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would remember God's great love poured out on the cross. Ask God to continually cause us to be amazed by His grace.
- Rejoice today that you have been saved by God's grace and not by your own efforts.
- Pray for those around you who have yet to put their faith in Christ. Ask God to stir their hearts and draw them to Himself.
- Pray that we would see many come to faith and be baptized here at Crowfield in 2026.

Day 5 – Praying to Be People Filled with Hope

Ephesians 1:18-19 – I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in His holy people, and His incomparably great power for us who believe.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would be people who are filled with hope because of the gospel.
- Ask God to help you see beyond the moment to all that he has in store for you.
- Pray that he would work in power in your life, freeing you to live for His glory.
- Ask God to make you ready to share the reason for your hope with family members, friends, co-workers, and neighbors.
- Pray specifically that people in your life will come to faith in Jesus this year.

Day 6 – Praying to Be People Faithfully Following Jesus

Colossians 1:22-23 – But now He has reconciled you by Christ’s physical body through death to present you holy in His sight, without blemish and free from accusation—if you continue in your faith, established and firm, and do not move from the hope held out in the gospel. This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would be steadfast in faith, holding on to the hope of the gospel.
- Ask God to fill you with confidence, knowing that He who began a good work in you will be faithful to continue His work in you until the day of Christ.
- Pray that today God would give you an opportunity to give witness to the power of the gospel.

Day 7 – Praying to Grow in Knowing God

Ephesians 1:17 – I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would be a people who grow in the knowledge and worship of the Lord.
- Pray that God would lead you, by His Spirit, to know Him better.
- Ask that He would work through the discipleship ministries of Crowfield Baptist to grow men and women, boys and girls in their love and knowledge of God.
- Ask God for increased engagement in the discipleship ministries of Crowfield Baptist.

Day 8 – Praying to Be People Who Seek God’s Face

Jeremiah 29:11-13 – “For I know the plans I have for you,” declares the LORD, “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.”

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would be people who seek God and His face more than any other thing.
- Ask God to stir us to pursue Him in prayer and in His Word.
- Pray that He would teach you to seek the prosperity and blessing that come from seeking and knowing Him.
- Ask God to grow you in prayer this year and pray that more people at Crowfield Baptist will commit themselves to seeking God in prayer.

Day 9 – Praying to Be People Who Delight in God

Psalm 37:4 – Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that we would find our delight and joy in God.
- Ask God to satisfy us and teach us to be content in Him.
- Pray that your heart will be drawn to Him more than anything else.
- Pray that, at Crowfield Baptist, we would be passionate worshippers of the Lord—demonstrating our delight in Him by service and giving.

Day 10 – Praying for Unity in Our Church Family

John 17:20-21 – My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

Prayer Points:

- Pray for unity in diversity among the members of Crowfield Baptist.
- Ask God to give us a gospel love that transcends all our differences.
- Pray that we would be devoted to one another, serving one another, and honoring one another.
- Ask God to give us a spirit of unity as we take risks and see changes as a church family—that we would value serving His Kingdom and seeing people transformed above all else.

Day 11 – Praying for Faithfulness to God’s Mission

1 Peter 2:9 – But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that Crowfield Baptist would faithfully declare the gospel to all men and women.
- Ask God to fill your heart with wonder as you remember how He saved you. Praise Him today for rescuing you from darkness and bringing you into the light.
- Ask God today to give you an opportunity to share the good news with someone around you. And pray that He would give them faith to believe.
- Ask God to save your lost family members, friends, co-workers, and neighbors.

Day 12 – Praying for Humble Hearts

Philippians 2:3-4 – Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of others.

Prayer Points:

- Ask God to give the people of Crowfield Baptist humble hearts, seeking the welfare of others above our own welfare.
- Ask God to uncover any selfish ambition or vain conceit in you.
- Pray for awareness of the opportunities you have to actively serve the interests of others.
- Pray that Crowfield would be a church that faithfully engages our community and seeks the welfare of our neighbors. Ask God to develop this kind of selfless love in our church family.

Day 13 – Praying for Generous Hearts and Lives

2 Corinthians 9:6-8 – Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

Prayer Points:


- Pray that the people of Crowfield Baptist would give generously.
- Ask God to give you a heart of joy in giving.
- Pray that He would increase your supply so that you can be more generous. Pray that, as a church, we would “abound in every good work.”
- Pray for our efforts to serve Goose Creek and the surrounding communities. Ask God to send workers and supply resources as we seek to play our part in His mission.

Day 14 – Praying for the Lord to Do Great Things in the Days Ahead!

2 Thessalonians 3:1 – As for other matters, brothers and sisters, pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it was with you.

Prayer Points:

- Pray that the message of the gospel would spread rapidly through our nation and around the world.
- Ask God to open the hearts and minds of those who hear the message. And pray that they will respond in faith.
- Pray specifically for those in your life who do not yet know Christ as Savior.
- Ask God to be merciful and bring them to saving faith in Jesus. Pray that Crowfield Baptist would see many come to faith in Jesus and be baptized this year.



14-DAYS OF PRAYER WHAT NOW?

“The greatest answer to prayer is more prayer.” – Samuel Chadwick

This is not the end. These fourteen days are just the beginning. As a church, we have seen God move and answer prayers. But the greatest work He has accomplished is to increase our awareness of His presence and our awareness of our need for His presence in our lives. We long to see Him move. We long to live in the delight and satisfaction of His great love. We have been stirred. Praying calls us to pray even more.

Continue to practice the spiritual discipline you have developed over these past few weeks. Maintain a set time to pray each day. You can continue to use this guide as prompts for you during your prayer time, just start back on Day 1. Or let your Bible reading lead your praying. There are also a number of good prayer resources you can use to further develop a lifestyle of prayer.
